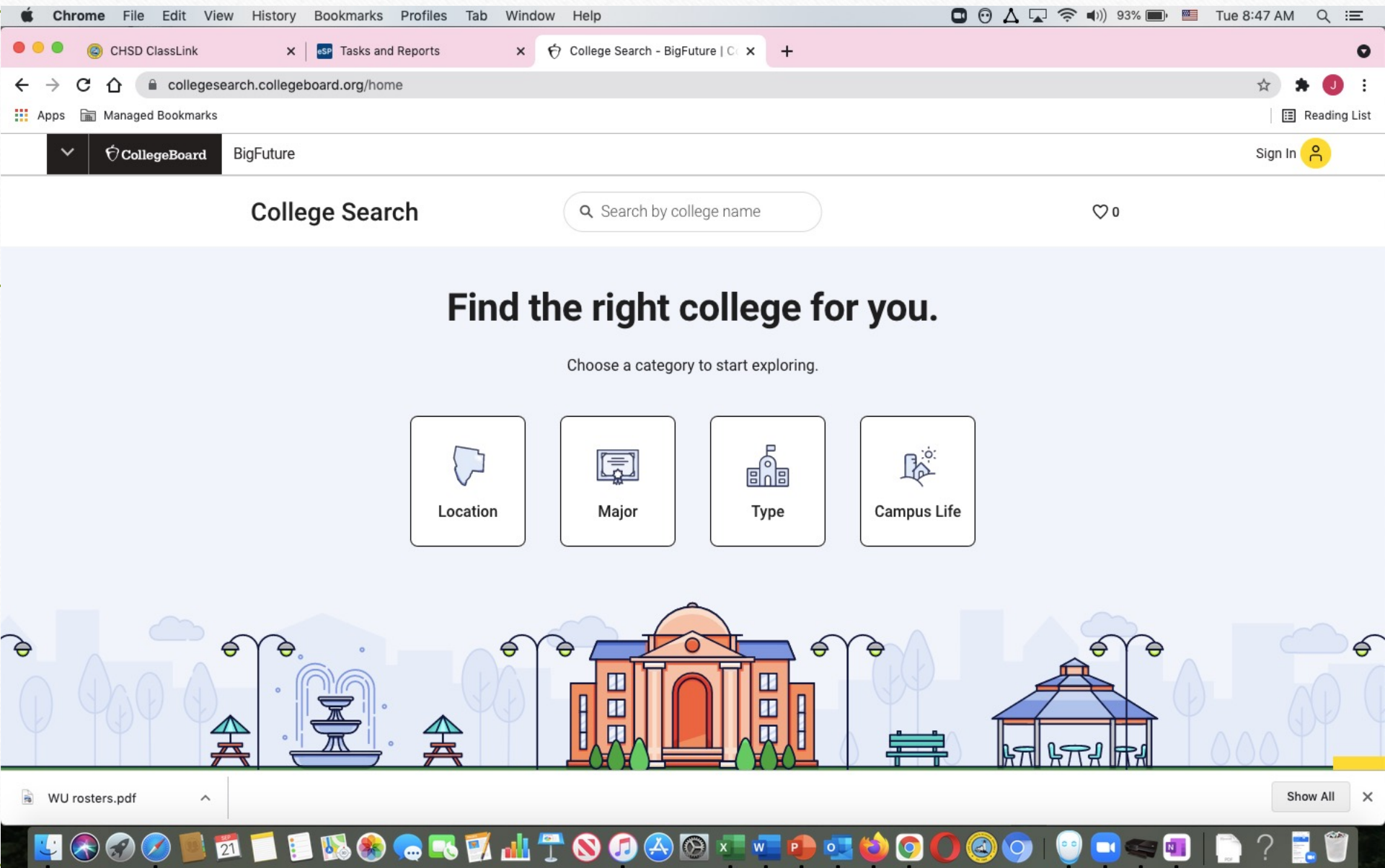

The first part of planning for college is understanding what factors colleges consider when looking at a student profile.

- Primary Factors

- Quality/Rigor of Academic Courses
- Academic Performance (Grades, class rank, upward trend)
- Test Scores (SAT, SAT Subject Tests, AP[®], etc.)



- Additional Factors

- Extracurricular Activities
- Essay(s)
- Letters of Recommendation
- Demonstrated Interest
- Discipline

ROADMAP TO COLLEGE

20 academic credits in grades 9 thru 12, and at least 5 of those units should be during senior year.

Some of your courses should be Honors or AP level.

Final grades should be A's and B's.

Cumulative GPA should be a B+ or higher.

A good record of conduct in the school and community.

 - All suspensions (ISS and OSS)

- With the PSAT/NMSQT
- you can: Access personalized college/career planning and get AP potential feedback
- Get ready for the SAT
- Enter the National Merit Scholarship Program for recognition & scholarships (open to Juniors only!)
- Request information from colleges and universities
- Date/Time: Wednesday, October 11, 2023
- Cost: \$18

SAT & ACT

- College Admissions tests
- Both widely accepted at colleges
- Statewide SAT in March for all Juniors – at school for free...
- Any additional testing register at www.collegeboard.org and www.actstudent.org
- Fee waivers available

School Day SAT

- March 6, 2024
- Every Cape Henlopen 11th grade student will take the SAT that day free of charge at Cape
- Students are automatically registered for this test
- Students will use their ipad at school to take the test

SAT vs. ACT

SAT

- Aptitude Test
- Range 400-1600
- Most common on east and west coasts
- \$55
- offered 7 Saturdays throughout year

ACT

- Achievement Test
- 1-36
- Most common in the midwest and south
- Cape Henlopen is planning to be a test site for December and June test dates
- \$60 without writing section

AP Testing

- ☐ Possible college credit
- ☐ Scores range 1-5 (3-5 passing)
- ☐ 19 courses at Cape
- ☐ Testing takes place in May
- ☐ Teachers will help students register for tests if taking AP
- ☐ Cost – \$98 per exam

Paying for college

- FAFSA www.fafsa.ed.gov
 - Opens during senior year (usually October, this year December)
 - Free Application for Federal Student Aid
 - Source of grants, loans, work study opportunity
 - We offer financial aid evenings for seniors and parents. We partner with Stand by Me to assist families.
 - You can check out some online FAFSA resources including calculator features to get an estimate of how much you may qualify for.
